

## APPENDIX

The following ordinances and resolutions are no longer of general interest, primarily because their provisions were carried out directly after their enactment. Since they are mainly of historical interest, it has not been considered necessary to include their entire text. Instead, they are arranged in groups, according to subject matter, and within each group listed by title in chronological order. The content of the ordinances and resolutions is indexed, in all necessary detail, in the general index at the end of this volume. The annual budget and tax ordinances have been listed only in the "Key to the Disposition of Ordinances." Any person who desires to read the full text of any of the ordinances or resolutions may do so by consulting the original Ordinance Books on file in the Borough Offices.

## Appendix 1

### AGREEMENTS AND CONTRACTS

1-1. Granting to the Stroudsburg and Bushkill Telephone Company the right to enter and occupy the streets and highways of the Borough of Stroudsburg. (Ordinance 39, May 1, 1895)

1-2. Granting to the Pennsylvania Telephone Company the right to occupy the streets and highways of the Borough of Stroudsburg with such poles and wires as may be required for conducting its business. (Ordinance 42, April 6, 1896)

1-3. Granting the right-of-way through Main Street in the Borough of Stroudsburg to the Stroudsburg Passenger Railway Company. (Ordinance 53, April 3, 1901)

1-4. Granting the right-of-way through Main Street in the Borough of Stroudsburg to the Stroudsburg Passenger Railway Company. (Ordinance 55, September 20, 1901)

1-5. Granting to the Monroe County Water Power and Supply Company the right to erect poles and string wires in the streets and alleys of the Borough of Stroudsburg for the conduct of its business. (Ordinance 67, August 3, 1904)

1-6. Granting the right-of-way through Dreher Avenue and a portion of Main Street in the Borough to the Stroudsburg and Wind Gap Electric Street Railway Company. (Ordinance 70, February 14, 1905)

1-7. Granting to the Monroe County Water Power and Supply Company the right to erect poles and string wires in the streets and alleys of the Borough for the conduct of its business. (Ordinance 81, June 1, 1910)

1-8. Granting to the Monroe County Water Power and Supply Company the right to erect poles and string wires in the streets and alleys of the Borough for the conduct of its business. (Ordinance 82, June 11, 1910)

1-9. Granting to the Stroudsburg Electric Light and Power Company the right to erect poles and string wires in the streets and alleys of the Borough for the conduct of its business. (Ordinance 83, June 11, 1910)

1-10. Granting to the Indian Queen Power Company the right to erect poles and string wires in the streets and alleys of the Borough for the conduct of its business. (Ordinance 89, May 19, 1911)

1-11. Authorizing the officials of the Borough to execute and deliver to the Stroudsburg Passenger Railway Company a lease, for the term of fifty (50) years, for a portion of a street in the Borough. (Ordinance 106, September 1, 1915)

1-12. Granting the right to the Stroudsburg Traction Company to lay tracks, erect and maintain its poles and string wires and cables for the operation of its railway as lessee of the Stroudsburg Passenger Railway Company. (Ordinance 136, June 11, 1925)

Authorizing the Bell Telephone Company of Pennsylvania to construct, maintain and operate such conduits, cables, wires, manholes, poles and all other necessary appliances, in, on, under, across and along the streets and alleys of the Borough as it may require in the maintenance and operation of its system. (Ordinance 163, January 2, 1929)

1-14. Authorizing the American Telegraph and Telephone Company of Pennsylvania to acquire and use such portions of the aerial and underground works now or in the future constructed or in place by the Bell Telephone Company of Pennsylvania, for connecting through line purposes, as said A.T. and T. Co. may require in the operation of its business. (Ordinance 164, January 25, 1929)

1-15. Providing for the furnishing of electric service to the Borough of Stroudsburg, for the operation of the Borough's sewage disposal plant. (Ordinance 215, July 7, 1936)

1-16. Providing for a contract of the installation, rental and purchase of parking meters. (Ordinance 241, June 14, 1939)

1-17. Providing for the furnishing of electric service to the Borough of Stroudsburg, for the operation of the Borough's sewage disposal plant. (Ordinance 262, December 10, 1941)

1-18. Providing for the purchase of additional parking meters. (Ordinance 266, February 4, 1942)

1-19. Providing for a public dumping ground for a period of five (5) years. (Ordinance 269, May 6, 1942)

1-20. Granting to the Pennsylvania Power and Light Company permission to erect and maintain electric lines and appurtenances upon certain property of the Borough of Stroudsburg. (Ordinance 365, September 2, 1953)

1-21. Providing for the furnishing of electric service to the Borough for the operation of its sewage disposal plant. (Ordinance 389, July 6, 1955)

1-22. Granting to the Pennsylvania Power and Light Company permission to construct, operate and maintain its electric lines on certain property of the Borough of Stroudsburg. (Ordinance 426, December 2, 1959)

Expressing the desire of the Borough authorities to increase the indebtedness of said Borough by the amount of twenty-nine thousand dollars (\$29,000.00) for the purpose of constructing a general sewage system; providing for an election to obtain the consent of the electors. (Ordinance 63, April 7, 1903)

2-2. Authorizing the issuance of coupon bonds to an amount not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for the purpose of redeeming outstanding bonds payable May 1, 1911; providing for the sale thereof, and assessing and levying an annual tax for the payment of the principal and interest thereof. (Ordinance 88, April 5, 1911)

2-3. Authorizing the issuance of coupon bonds to an amount not exceeding eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.00) for the purpose of redeeming outstanding bonds payable June 1, 1913 and June 1, 1914; providing for the sale thereof; and assessing and levying an annual tax for the payment of the principal and interest thereof. Expressing the desire of the Borough authorities to increase the indebtedness of said Borough by the amount of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) for the purpose of paying the Borough's share to permanently improve Main Street; providing for an election to obtain the consent of the electors. (Ordinance 98, July 1, 1914)

2-5. Authorizing the issuance of coupon bonds to an amount not exceeding twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds to pay the Borough's share to permanently improve Main Street; authorizing the State and County to bear the major portion of the expense. (Ordinance 104, June 2, 1915)

2-6. Authorizing the issuance of coupon bonds to an amount not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds for redeeming outstanding notes to the amount of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00); providing for the sale thereof, and assessing an annual tax for the payment of the principal and interest thereof. (Ordinance 110, September 13, 1916)

2-7. Authorizing the issuance of coupon bonds to an amount not exceeding thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds for redeeming promissory notes to the amount of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00); providing for the sale thereof, and assessing an annual tax for the payment of the principal and interest thereof. (Ordinance 123, August 12, 1920)

2-8. Authorizing the issuance of coupon bonds to an amount not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds for redeeming outstanding and unpaid bonds; providing for the sale thereof, and assessing an annual tax for the payment of the principal and interest thereof. (Ordinance 129, August 1, 1923)

Expressing the desire of the Borough authorities to increase the bonded indebtedness of said Borough by the amount of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds for constructing a municipal building for the use of the Borough and for the housing of the five companies and their equipment; providing for the holding of an election to obtain the consent of the electors. (Ordinance 177, May 6, 1931)

2-12. Authorizing an increase in the bonded indebtedness of the Borough in the amount of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds for constructing a municipal building for the use of the Borough and for the housing of the five companies and their equipment; approving the form of the bond and coupon; and levying a tax for the payment of the principal of said bonds at maturity, and the interest and state tax thereon meanwhile. (Ordinance 178, November 1, 1931)

Authorizing an increase in the bonded indebtedness of the Borough in the amount of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000.00) for the purpose of providing funds for constructing a municipal building for the use of the Borough and for the housing of the five companies and their equipment; approving the form of the bond and coupon; and levying a tax for the payment of the principal of said bonds at maturity, and the interest and state tax thereon meanwhile. Expressing the desire of the Borough authorities to increase the bonded indebtedness of said Borough by the amount of eighty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$82,500.00) for the purpose of providing funds for paying part of the cost of constructing sewage treatment works and an extension of the present sanitary sewage system; providing for the holding of an election to obtain the consent of the electors. - A. For all matters requiring a public hearing, the charge is the actual expenses involved in the public hearing, but not less than \$150. A deposit of \$150 is to be made before the hearing, and the additional amounts, if any, will be billed by the zoning office. (Resolution of August 3, 1977)
