Part 1

General Regulations

§101. Definitions and Interpretation.

1. Words and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed in the Vehicle Code, 75 P.S. §§101-9701 (1977), as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, unless the context clearly indicates a different meaning.

ABANDONED VEHICLE—

- A. Any motor vehicle that is left unattended on or along any highway, street, alley or other public property in the Borough of Stroudsburg for more than forty-eight (48) hours and does not meet any of the following:
 - (1) A valid registration plate.
 - (2) A certificate of inspection.
 - (3) An ascertainable vehicle identification number.
- B. This also includes vehicles that do meet any of the requirements but are dismantled, wrecked or inoperable.

§102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances, as parts of ordinances, as amendments to ordinances, or as amendments to this chapter.

§103. Continuation of Prior Regulations.

The provisions of this chapter, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances in force immediately prior to the adoption of this Chapter 15, are intended as a continuation of such ordinances and regulations and not as new enactments. The provisions of this chapter shall not affect any act done or liability incurred, nor shall they affect any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted to enforce any right or penalty or to punish any offense under any such ordinances or regulations as aforesaid.

§104. Temporary and Emergency Regulations.

1. The Mayor or Manager shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
 - A. In the case of flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations;
 - B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
2. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter 15 for a violation of such nature, and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25 together with costs of prosecution.

§105. Experimental Regulations.

The Borough Council may, from time to time, designate places upon and along the highways in the Borough where for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective just as they had been specified in this chapter. No person shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this section. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the pen-

alty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature, and in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25 together with costs of prosecution; provided, the purpose of this section is to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Borough relative to traffic and parking.

§106. Authority of Police Officers.

The police officers of the Stroud Area Regional Police Department are hereby given authority to direct traffic on the highways of the Borough and at intersections thereof.

§107. Authorization for Use of Speed Timing Devices.

1. The Stroud Area Regional Police Department is hereby authorized to use all mechanical or electrical speed timing devices for the determination of speed of a motor vehicle as are approved or will be approved by the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, including but not limited to E.S.P. and Vascar systems.
2. This section authorizes the use of said devices upon all highways within the Borough be they Borough, county or state highways and does also hereby elect to exercise all powers granted to "local authorities" under the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 75 P.S. §§101-9701 (1977), as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

§201. Motor Vehicles not to be Driven on Sidewalks.

No person shall drive any vehicle except a human powered vehicle upon a sidewalk or sidewalk area except upon a permanent or duly authorized temporary driveway. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 together with costs of prosecution.

Any person who shall operate a vehicle at a speed in excess of that established therefor, upon any highway or portion thereof as specified in this section, shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$35 and, for exceeding a maximum speed limit by more than five miles-per-hour, shall pay an additional fine of \$2 for each mile-per-hour in excess of five miles-per-hour over the maximum speed limit.

§203. Traffic Signals at Certain Intersections.

At the following intersections, official traffic signals shall be erected (or are hereby ratified if heretofore erected), and traffic at such intersections shall be directed by such signals:

1. N. Fourth Street and McConnell Street
2. N. Fifth Street and Main Street
3. N. Sixth Street and Main Street
4. N. Seventh Street and Main Street
5. N. Eighth Street and Main Street
6. N. Ninth Street and Main Street
7. Dreher Avenue and Main Street
8. S. Seventh Street and Ann Street

- 9. N. Fifth Street and Sarah Street
- 10. Broad Street and Ann Street
- 11. N. Third Street and McConnell Street

Any driver of a vehicle who shall disobey the directions of any traffic signal shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 together with costs of prosecution.

§204. Right Turn on Red Signal Prohibited at Certain Intersection.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle traveling on the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions hereby indicated in each case to make a right turn when his or her vehicle is facing a steady red traffic signal:

§205. Stop Intersections.

The following intersections are hereby established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are hereby ratified if heretofore erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions hereby indicated. It shall be unlawful for all vehicles approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions hereby indicated, to not come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any such intersection:

Provided: the aforesaid weight limit shall not apply to any motor vehicle or other vehicle, trailer or tractor-trailer combination making deliveries or picking up goods, wares, material or merchandise at or on premises located in any such street or portion thereof, listed above, or any motor vehicle or other vehicle, or trailer or tractor-trailer combination for which a special permit to operate on any such street or portion thereof shall have been issued by the Chief of Police. Provided further: the provisions of this section shall not apply to the driving of vehicles hauling food or household goods, public utility vehicles, fire-fighting equipment, garbage and rubbish vehicles, or school and public transportation buses. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$75 plus \$75 for each 500 pounds, or part thereof, in excess of 3,000 pounds over the maximum allowable weight limit, together with costs of prosecution.

§208. Unlawful to Operate Motor Vehicles on Streets Closed for Construction or Repair.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle upon any street that is under construction, resurfacing or repair, in disregard of any official sign, barricade or notice that the same is closed to vehicular traffic. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 together with costs of prosecution.

§209. Play Streets Authorized.

The [Mayor/Manager] is hereby authorized to designate as play streets, whenever and for whatever period of time he shall deem advisable, any portion of any street whereon sledding and coasting shall be permitted. Such street shall be set apart for this purpose under the direction of the [Mayor/Manager].

No person shall operate any motor vehicle upon any play street at any time when such street shall be so designated, except in case of emergency, with special permission of the Police Officer in charge, who shall first clear such play street of all persons using such street for the purpose for which it was set aside.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 together with costs of prosecution.

Part 3

General Parking Regulations

§301. Parking Without Lights Authorized.

The boundary limits of the Borough of Stroudsburg are hereby established as a zone in which motor vehicles may remain standing without lights, and all highways within such boundary limits are hereby designated as highways where motor vehicles may remain standing without lights.

§302. Loading and Unloading.

The loading and unloading of goods, wares and merchandise is hereby restricted to such length of time as is absolutely necessary for the purpose of loading or unloading of such goods, wares and merchandise. For the purpose of enforcement of this section, such loading or unloading of any vehicle shall not be considered as parking; provided, without having first obtained permission from the Chief of Police to do so, no person shall load or unload a vehicle from any place upon any street or alley in the Borough where parking is prohibited; or shall allow a vehicle to remain, for loading or unloading, in any place upon any street or alley where parking is limited as to time, for longer than the time for which parking is permitted; or shall load or unload upon any street or alley in such a way that one lane for vehicular traffic shall not be kept open at all times. Where such permission is granted by the Chief of Police, he may, at his discretion, block off the portion of the street or alley affected by such loading or unloading.

§303. Angle Parking Required on Portions of Certain Streets.

1. Only angle parking shall be permitted on the following portions of the streets:

§304. Vehicles to be Parked Within Spaces; Parking Prohibited in Certain Areas.

1. Wherever a particular parking space shall be lined or marked off on any street or alley or upon the adjacent curb, every vehicle parked shall be parked within the lines marking such parking space. All vehicles parked on streets or alleys, whether parking spaces are marked or not, shall be parked only in the direction of the permitted traffic flow.
2. Parking shall be prohibited at all times by any vehicle which in any way will block the intersection of any street or alley or the entrance or exit of any street or alley. Parking shall at all times be prohibited within the painted line area adjacent to any fire hydrant; within the painted line area marking the permissible distance to park from any intersection; in any area where erected signs or painted lines indicate a "No Parking" area; in any manner so as to block any private or public driveway or access way to a parking lot or parking facility or other facility of the Borough.
3. Parking shall be prohibited at all times on any Borough street on a sidewalk. For purposes of this section, sidewalk shall be defined as that portion of a street between curblines or the lateral line of a roadway and the adjacent property lines intended for use by pedestrians and not intended for use by vehicles. This sidewalk shall specifically include that area between the curblines and any paved pedestrian cartway.
4. Except as otherwise hereafter provided, parking of any motor vehicles shall be prohibited at all times in all areas of the borough that are not otherwise approved for parking in other sections of Chapter 15. This section shall not apply to the C-1, C-2 and C-3 Commercial Zoning Districts.

§310. Parking for Repairs.

The parking of any motor vehicle, tractor or trailer, or combination thereof, upon streets and highways of the Borough of Stroudsburg for repairs, whether upon the traveled or untraveled portion thereof, shall be temporary only and limited to times for emergency repairs. This section shall not be construed to permit parking for repairs at locations where parking is otherwise prohibited.

§311. Trailer Parking Restricted.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park a trailer (which shall mean a vehicle without motive power, designed to carry property of passengers or designed and used exclusively for living quarters wholly on its own structure, and to be drawn by a motor vehicle or tractor and including, but not limited to, house trailers, boat trailers, and rental handling trailers), upon any street or highway in the Borough of Stroudsburg, without having attached to such trailer a means of mechanical traction constructed or designed for the purpose of drawing such trailer.

§312. Penalties.

1. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part shall be assessed a fine of \$15 if paid within 10 days, with the exception of a fire hydrant violation, in which case the fine will be \$50.
2. If not paid within 10 days of the date on the ticket, the fine will be increased to \$35, with the exception of a fire hydrant violation, in which case the fine will be \$100. [Ord. 916]

§313. Tow-Away Zones Established.

- 1. The following tow-away zones are hereby established, and it shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle or to allow the same to remain parked in any such zone during the times indicated. Violators' vehicles will be towed away at owner's expense.

- 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle or to allow the same to remain parked in a temporary no-parking zone as described below. The Stroud Area Regional Police Department shall have vehicles towed away at the owner's expense when vehicles are parked in violation of said temporary no-parking zones, provided the temporary no-parking signs are posted five hours before the beginning of the no-parking time period stated on the sign, or in the case of no-parking time periods beginning between 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m., at least 10 hours before said no-parking time period begins; provided, further, temporary no-parking signs stating the hours during which parking is prohibited and that the violators' vehicles shall be towed away at the owner's expense are posted in compliance with this paragraph. Vehicles parked in violation of temporary no-parking signs shall also receive citations as provided by this Chapter 15 and state law.

§315. Parking Prohibited by Type of Vehicle.

- 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or the owner of any vehicle to allow a vehicle to remain parked on any highway or street within Stroudsburg Borough

which is a vehicle of the class or type listed below:

- A. Any truck, truck-tractor, bus, or combination having a height of greater than nine feet or a length of greater than 20 feet.

- B. No dumpster, collection bin, or other non-motorized vehicle shall be left upon any highway or street within Stroudsburg Borough without a permit being obtained from the Borough and adequate reflectors or safety devices being placed to prevent vehicles from colliding with the dumpster, collection bin, or vehicle.
- (1) Permits will be given for a period of no longer than two weeks. A \$25 nonrefundable fee will be charged for each permit period. Permits may be renewed for an additional two weeks up to a period of 28 days from the date the permit was first issued. For periods lasting longer than 28 days, the applicant must make a written request to the Borough Manager or the Manager's designated representative for a longer period.
 - (2) Dumpsters, collection bins or other nonmotorized vehicles shall first be parked on the property where the work will take place. Any damage done to public property while placing the dumpster, collection bin or other nonmotorized vehicle will be replaced or repaired by the property owner where the permit is issued to the satisfaction of the Borough of Stroudsburg. If not repaired within 30 days, the Borough may make the repair and charge the cost to the property owner.
 - (3) If the dumpster, collection bin or other nonmotorized vehicle is to be parked on public property, any damage done to public property will be replaced or repaired by the property owner where the permit is issued to the satisfaction of the Borough of Stroudsburg. If not repaired within 30 days, the Borough may make the repair and charge the cost to the property owner.
 - (4) If located on public property, the owner must make every effort to include, but not limited to, providing a collection chute, to protect pedestrians and property from damage. The type of protection will be stated on the application.
 - (5) All dumpsters on public property shall be covered with a securely fastened cover during nonwork hours.
 - (6) If located on a street where meter parking is enforced, the property owner must purchase sufficient meter bags at the daily rate. The property owner is responsible for ensuring the meter bags are placed and removed. The bags must be paid for prior to issuing the permit. Dumpsters, collection bins or other nonmotorized vehicles will not normally be allowed on Main Street within the Borough limits.
 - (7) Full dumpsters or collection bins will be replaced within 24 hours when the level of trash is approximately one foot below the top of the dumpster or collection bin. The Borough of Stroudsburg has the right to call to have any dumpster or collection bin removed immediately at

the property owner's expense when the level of trash exceeds the top of the dumpster or collection bin.

- (8) Any violation of the above will result in revocation of the permit and any fines further defined in this Section.
- (9) Penalties. Any person who shall violate any provisions of this Section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of up to \$50 together with costs of prosecution.

2. Exceptions.

- A. Moving vans for a period of not more than 24 hours unless meeting the criteria in Subsection C.
- B. Between sunrise and sunset, a vehicle of this type may be parked for the purpose of loading or unloading property for a period not to exceed two hours if parking is not otherwise prohibited.
- C. Any vehicle of this type which is actively being loaded or unloaded.

3. Notice of Restriction. Notice of parking restrictions shall be provided by means of posted traffic control devices, certified letter, personal service, or by placing a notice on the windshield or any other readily visible location on the vehicle. In absence of a posted traffic control device, enforcement of this subsection shall not take place unless a notice of violation has been issued to the owner of the vehicle at least 48 hours prior to the date and time of enforcement and the owner has failed to cure the violation within this time period.

§317. Abandoned Vehicles.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to own or have custody of any abandoned vehicle or to permit any such vehicle to be parked upon any street, highway, alley or other public property in the Borough of Stroudsburg for more than 48 hours.
2. The Borough of Stroudsburg, once it has identified the owner or person having custody of any abandoned vehicle, will notify that person requiring removal of the abandoned vehicle within 48 hours after receipt of the notice. Notices for removal will be any or all of the following methods:
 - A. Posting or affixing the notice to the vehicle.
 - B. Hand delivery to the address of the vehicle owner.
 - C. Sent by certified mail.
3. If the vehicle is not moved or still does not meet all of the legal requirements for operation as stated in §101, the vehicle will be towed by the Borough of Stroudsburg in accordance with Part 5 of this chapter at the expense of the owner.

- B. Municipal Parking Lot No. 2 shall be controlled by meters and permits. Metering shall be enforced between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., prevailing local time, Monday through Saturday. Permits shall be enforced 24 hours. [Ord. 903]
- C. Municipal Parking Lot No. 3 shall be controlled by meters and permits. Metering shall be enforced between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., prevailing local time, Monday through Saturday. Permits shall be enforced 24 hours. [Ord. 903]
- D. Municipal Parking Lot No. 4, known as the "Sarah Street Extension Parking Lot," shall be controlled by parking permits, which will be enforced 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
- E. Municipal Parking Lot No. 5 shall be controlled by meters and parking permits. Metering shall be enforced between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., prevailing local time, on Monday through Saturday. Permits shall be enforced 24 hours. [Ord. 903]

§402. Installation and Characteristics of and Control Over Parking Meters.

Parking meters shall be installed in each of the parking meter zones and municipal parking lots established, immediately adjacent to each individual parking space. Each

meter shall be placed or set in such manner as to show that the parking space adjacent to such meter is or is not legally occupied. Each meter installed shall indicate by a proper legend the legal parking time established by the Borough and, when occupied, shall indicate by its dial and pointer the duration of the period of legal parking and, on expiration of such period, shall indicate illegal or overtime parking. Such meters, after installation, shall be under the management and supervision of the Borough Manager.

§403. Parked Vehicles To Be Wholly Within Marked Spaces.

Lines and/or markings shall be painted or placed upon the curb, sidewalk and/or street adjacent to each parking meter for the purpose of designating the parking space for which such meter is to be used. Each vehicle parked adjacent to any parking meter shall be parked wholly within the lines or markings so placed and applicable to such meter. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle across any such line or marking, or to park any vehicle in such a position that such vehicle shall not be wholly within the area so designated by such lines or markings.

§404. Manner of Parking at Meter.

When a parking space in any parking meter zone is parallel with the adjacent curb or sidewalk, any vehicle parked in such parking space shall be parked so that the front of such vehicle shall be nearest to the parking meter; when a parking space in any parking meter zone is diagonal to the curb or sidewalk, any vehicle parked in such parking space shall be parked with the front of such vehicle nearest to such meter.

§405. Coin Deposit in Meters.

Any person or persons causing a vehicle to be parked in a parking space shall deposit in the parking meter adjacent to such space coin or coins of the United States of America according to the time limits and rates indicated on the legend of such meter.

§406. Rates for Parking.

The Borough Council of the Borough of Stroudsburg may, by resolution, from time to time revise and change parking rates and determine the length of time that parking is

permissible in any individual parking space which is regulated by the meter immediately adjacent thereto; and notice thereof shall be given to the public, stating the length of time during which parking is permitted and the conditions regulating the same, by either placing said notice on the parking meter or in the immediate vicinity of said parking facility.

§407. Unlawful to Park After Time on Meter Has Elapsed; Evidence of Violation.

Any person or persons who cause a vehicle to remain in a parking space after the prescribed time, for which coins or tokens have been deposited, has elapsed is hereby determined to be illegally parked; and each additional hour that such person or persons permit such vehicle to remain in an individual parking space after the prescribed time for parking has elapsed is hereby declared to be an additional violation. The fact that a vehicle is in an individual parking space when the time signal on the parking meter regulating said parking space shows that no parking is permitted, or that the time has expired, shall be deemed prima facie evidence of the unlawful parking of said vehicle by its operator and/or owner. The elapse of one hour from the time reported on the notice to the owner or operator of a motor vehicle shall be deemed prima facie evidence of additional violations of the parking of said motor vehicle by the operator or owner.

§408. Unlawful to Deposit Coin in Meter to Extend Parking Time Beyond Legal Limit.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this Part for any person to deposit or to cause to be deposited in any parking meter any coin for the purpose of increasing or extending the parking time of any vehicle beyond the total legal parking time in a parking meter zone.

§409. Tampering with Meters Unlawful.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this Part 4 for any person to deface, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter, or parking meter stand or coin depository installed under the provisions of this Part; provided, nothing herein shall apply to the servicing or opening of parking meters by officers, employees and/or police officers of the Borough under the direction of the Mayor and/or the Borough Council.

§410. Report of Violations.

1. It shall be the duty of the police officers and parking enforcement person of the Borough, in accordance with the instructions of the Borough Manager or Chief of Police, to report all violations of any provision of this Part 4, indicating, in each case:
 - A. The section thereof violated.
 - B. The location where such violation took place; including the parking meter at which the vehicle was illegally parked.
 - C. The State and license number of such vehicle.
 - D. The date and time of violation.
 - E. The date and time of the notice of the violation.
 - F. Other facts deemed necessary for a clear understanding of the circumstances attending the violation.
2. Every such police officer or parking enforcement person shall place upon such vehicle a notice to the owner or driver thereof that such vehicle was parked in violation of a provision of this Part, and shall indicate on the notice the date and time the notice was placed on the vehicle.

§411. Suspension of Regulations.

The Borough Council may suspend in whole or in part the parking meter regulations set forth in this Part 4 during such days and hours as may be designated by them.

§412. Fines.

Any person, firm, corporation or owner of any vehicle parked in violation of any provision of this Part 4, or aiding, abetting or assisting in the violation thereof, shall be assessed a fine in accordance with the following schedule:

- A. Five dollars for each separate parking violation if paid within 10 days of the time the notice of violation was issued, except violations of §408 will have a fine of \$15.

The owner or driver may discharge the fine by paying the sum of \$5 or \$15, respectively, at the Municipal Building, 700 Sarah Street, within the time limit.

- B. If not paid within 10 days of the date on the ticket, the fine will be increased to \$25, except violations of §408 will have a fine of \$35. [Ord. 916]
- C. If payment is not made within 20 days of the date on the ticket, prosecution will be initiated, and the fine will be increased to \$50, except violations of §408 will have a fine of \$60, plus the cost of prosecution. [Ord. 916]
- D. The penalty for violating §409 depends on the extent of damage inflicted. The act may be punishable as a felony, misdemeanor or summary offense (18 P.S. §3304).

§413. Disposition of Fines.

§414. Collection of Meter and Fine Depositories.

§416. Municipal Parking Lot Parking Permits.

The Borough of Stroudsburg shall offer for sale to members of the public parking permits in the downtown area to be used in the municipal parking lots. The permit will allow for unrestricted parking at any meter within the metered lots, except for those days and times listed in §401. The permits shall be sold on a quarterly basis at a fee set by the Borough Council. The Council of the Borough may by resolution, from time to time, revise and change the fee for these permits.

§417. Display of Permit.

The permit shall be hung from the rearview mirror while parked in said lot. Failure to properly display the permit may result in a parking violation and/or fine.

Part 5

Removal and Impoundment of Illegally Parked Vehicles

§501. Authority to Remove and Impound Illegally Parked Vehicles.

The Stroud Area Regional Police Department is hereby authorized to remove and impound, or to order the removal and impoundment of any vehicle parked upon any street, alley, highway or public property in the Borough in violation of any provision of the law or of any ordinance of the Borough. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983; as amended by Ordinance 747, December 4, 1996; as amended by Ordinance 784, April 5, 2000, §2)

§501.1. Scofflaw.

If any motor vehicle/conveyance is illegally parked in violation of this Part or any applicable provision of the Motor Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or whose owner is delinquent in payment of fines and costs imposed by a district magistrate and for whom a warrant of arrest has been issued by a district magistrate as a result of his violation of the parking laws of the Borough of Stroudsburg or the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, then that owner's motor vehicle(s) conveyance(s) shall be prohibited from parking on any streets within the Borough and shall be seized, removed and impounded. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983; as added by Ordinance 747, December 4, 1996)

§502. Approved Storage Garages.

The Borough Council shall have authority to designate, from time to time, one (1) or more garages as approved storage garages, to serve as a pound for the storage of such impounded vehicles. The designation of approved storage garage may be granted by the Borough Council upon receipt of an acceptable application and the posting of a bond or insurance as specified in §504. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983; as amended by Ordinance 747, December 4, 1996)

§503. Towing and Storage Charges.

Every such approved storage garage shall have authority to charge the owner of record of every such impounded vehicle the towing and storage charges. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983)

§504. Garage to Post Bond.

Every such approved storage garage shall furnish a bond in an adequate amount as shall be fixed by the Borough Council, for the indemnifying of the owner of any such im-

pounded vehicle against the loss thereof, or injury or damage thereto, while in the custody of the keeper of the pound. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983)

§505. Notification to Owners of Impounded Vehicles.

Within twenty-four (24) hours from the time of removal of any vehicle under authority granted by this part, notice of the fact that such vehicle has been impounded shall be sent by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation to the owner of record of such vehicle. Such notice shall include the make, model, title number, vehicle identification number and registration plate number, the location the vehicle is held, notification of the right to reclaim said vehicle within thirty (30) days after the date of the notice upon payment of a fee for towing and storage charges, and notification that failure to reclaim said vehicle is deemed consent to the disposition of the vehicle. Such vehicle(s) shall not be released from impoundment until all fines and penalties due the Borough are paid. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983)

§506. Effect of Payment of Towing and Impoundment Charges Without Protest.

The payment of any towing and impounding charges, authorized by this Part shall, unless such payment shall have been made under protest, be final and conclusive, and shall constitute a waiver of any right to recover the money so paid. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983)

§507. Effect of Payment of Towing and Impoundment Charges Under Protest.

In the event that any towing and impounding charges, authorized by this part, shall be paid under protest, the offender shall be entitled to a hearing before a District Justice or court of record having jurisdiction, in which case the defendant shall be proceeded against and shall receive such notice as is provided for by the Vehicle Code,* in other cases of summary offenses, and shall have the same rights as to appeal and waiver of hearing. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983)

§508. Records of Vehicles Removed and Impounded.

The Police Department shall keep a record of all vehicles impounded, and it shall be able at all reasonable times to furnish the owners or agents of the owners thereof, information as to the place of storage of such vehicles. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983)

§509. Owner or Operator of Vehicle Remain Liable for Fine or Penalty.

The payment of towing and storage charges shall not operate to relieve the owner or operator of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of any law or ordinance on account of which such vehicle was removed and impounded. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983)

§510. Restrictions upon Removal of Vehicles.

No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this part if, at the time of the intended removal thereof, the owner or person for the time being in charge of such vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove such vehicle immediately. (Ordinance 599, December 19, 1983)

Part 6

Snow and Ice Emergency

§601. Definitions.

The following words when used in this Part shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

CHAINS – full chains, strap chains or other types of chains mounted on both rear wheels of a motorized vehicle.

PRIMARY SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTE – designated streets, as defined in §605 of this Part, which are primary transportation routes through the Borough and are considered to be essential to the rapid movement of emergency vehicles and normally carry the heaviest traffic volume or represent a significant physical hazard during times of snow.

SNOW – any precipitation depositing snow, sleet, hail, ice and freezing rain on streets within the Borough.

SNOW REMOVAL CONDITION – a snow removal condition is hereby declared to exist in the Borough whenever one of the following exists:

- (1) Accumulation to a depth of three inches or more; when this condition exists due to depth of accumulation, no action by the Mayor or Borough official is necessary to implement the conditions of this Part.
- (2) Or when, in the opinion of the Mayor or such person designated by the Mayor, the street conditions are hazardous and dangerous to vehicular and pedestrian traffic because of snow accumulation.

SNOW TIRES – tires having treads designed for use in snow, which tires must be in such condition as to serve the purpose for which they are designed.

VEHICLE – any self-propelled motorized vehicle licensed to travel upon the streets, roads and highways of the Borough.

§602. Notice and Duration of Snow Removal Condition.

In the event of a snow removal condition, said condition shall occur immediately and notice shall immediately be issued to local radio and news services. In either instance, a snow removal condition is presumed to continue for a period of 24 hours following the accumulation of snow or until such other period of time as designated by the Mayor.

§603. Alternate Parking Requirement.

In the event of a snow removal condition, parking will be permitted on the streets with the same conditions as stated in §307, "Alternate Parking Established on Certain Streets."

§604. Unattended Vehicles Prohibited During Emergency.

During such time as a snow removal condition is in effect or alternate side parking as a result of a snow removal condition, it shall be a violation of this Part for any person, firm, organization or entity to park, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle on any streets, roads, highways or any specified side of the street and municipal parking lots and their adjacent right-of-ways within the boundaries of the Borough that have been publicly designated for snow removal or plowing.

§605. Certain Streets Designated for Snow Removal.

The following streets within the Borough are hereby designated for snow removal or plowing, and parking thereon shall be prohibited while a snow removal condition is in effect:

§606. Notification of Primary Snow Route.

During the period of November 1, to May 1, the primary snow route shall be identified by signage consistent with approved traffic markings and shall notice the public of the right of the Borough to remove cars which are left unattended during a period of snow emergency. Secondary snow routes or other provisions of a Mayor's proclamation shall be noticed by notifying news sources and temporarily marking roads when appropriate and feasible.

§607. Snow Tires or Chains Required.

During such time as a snow removal condition is in effect, any person, firm, organization or entity operating or causing to be operated a vehicle which is not equipped with appropriate tires for winter conditions or chains upon any street, road or highway within the boundaries of the Borough resulting in such vehicle becoming stalled or incapable of moving under its own power, or who leaves such vehicle abandoned or unattended on any street, road or highway within the boundaries of the Borough as a result of its inability to move under its own power because of its failure to be equipped with snow tires or chains, shall be in violation of this Part 6 and shall be subject to the penalties and fines set forth in §608.

§608. Penalties.

1. During such time as a snow removal condition is in effect, any person who shall park a vehicle anywhere upon or along any of the streets of the Borough that have been publicly designated for snow removal or plowing shall be guilty of a violation of this Part 6 and, upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$15 if paid within 10 days.

- A. If not paid within 10 days of the date on the ticket, the fine will be increased to \$35. [Ord. 916]
 - B. If payment is not made within 20 days of the date on the ticket, prosecution will be initiated, and the fine will be increased to \$60 plus the cost of prosecution. [Ord. 916]
2. Any person who shall operate a vehicle upon the streets of the Borough, if such vehicle shall become stalled during such time as a snow removal condition is in effect, and if such stalling shall have been by reason of the failure to have such vehicle equipped as prescribed in §607 of this Part, shall be guilty of a violation of this Part and, upon conviction thereof, such person shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 together with costs of prosecution.

Part 7

Residential Parking Districts

§701. Council to Designate Residential Parking Districts.

The Borough Council may, in compliance with this Part 7, designate, repeal, or revise residential parking districts, and it may establish the parking restrictions, i.e., days, hours, exemptions for each district. Residential parking districts shall not be designated in a non-residential zone as ordained by the Borough of Stroudsburg's zoning ordinance. The process of designating, revising, or repealing any residential parking district could begin either by Borough Council's initiative or upon submission of a petition to Council from residents of the district.

§702. Designation Criteria.

A residential area shall be deemed impacted and thereby eligible for residential parking district designation provided the following criteria are satisfied:

- A. The area must be zoned residential.
- B. During the proposed hours of restricted parking, except any holidays proposed for exemption, the number of vehicles of non-residents parked legally or illegally on a street in the district is equal to 30% or more of the legal on-street parking capacity of the street. The percentage of non-resident parking shall be determined by averaging the results of two surveys conducted on different days and at different times of the day but within the hours of restricted parking. For purposes of this evaluation, a legal parking space shall be 22 linear feet.

§703. Public Hearing.

The Borough Council shall hold a public hearing on any proposed designation of, revision to, or repeal of a residential parking district. The public hearing shall be held only after the Borough Manager has compiled data to determine if the area satisfies the criteria for designation and the proposed ordinance and public hearings have been duly advertised.

§704. Final Action.

Within 65 days following the public hearing, the Borough Council shall take final action on the proposed ordinance.

§705. Parking Restriction in Residential Parking Districts.

Except for motor vehicles displaying a valid permit for the proper residential parking district, it shall be unlawful for any person to park any motor vehicle, or allow any motor vehicle to be parked, in a residential parking district for more than the time allowed by the parking restrictions established for that district. The parking restrictions for each residential parking district shall be established by ordinance of the Borough Council at the time each respective district is created. Residential parking permit holders must comply with all other parking regulations in effect at the time the district is designated or as may be amended by the Borough Council. In areas with existing parking meters, vehicles displaying a valid residential parking district permit may be parked in metered spaces within the designated district without the need to deposit coins.

§706. Residency Required for Permit.

1. A residential parking district permit shall be issued to any vehicle of a resident of a residential parking district for the district in which the person resides. A residential parking district permit shall also be issued to any vehicle of an adversely impacted neighbor of a residential parking district, provided that the adversely impacted neighbor meets the conditions set forth in §706, Subsection 2, of this section. In addition to the residential parking district permit, each dwelling unit in a residential parking district making application shall receive two short-term visitors' passes. The short-term visitors' passes shall be valid for a three-day period. For the purpose of this Part 7, a resident is any adult who lives or resides in a structure approved for residential occupancy and who is the owner of or a tenant in the structure or who can demonstrate some other indication of exclusive right of occupancy. A person who maintains a seasonal or temporary residence in excess of 100 consecutive days within the permit year shall also be considered a resident, provided that the structure being occupied is approved for temporary or seasonal residential occupancy.
2. When the designation of residential parking district adversely impacts other Borough residents because their residence is not situated within the residential parking district and because they do not have on- or off-street parking, the adversely impacted neighbor may petition the Borough Council for a residential parking district permit. The adversely impacted neighbor must prove to Council's satisfaction, the following:

- A. That the applicant (adversely impacted neighbor) is a resident as defined in §706 above;
 - B. That the applicant resides in a residential zoning district;
 - C. That a portion of the applicant's property (residence) is within 80 feet of the residential parking district;
 - D. That the applicant shows his/her property (residence) does not abut a street where on-street [parking] is allowed; and
 - E. That the applicant demonstrates the lack of adequate off-street parking and the inability to develop the property to provide for legal off-street parking.
3. Borough Council shall hold a public hearing on the application and make a decision on same within 65 days of the hearing. An adversely impacted neighbor whose application has been approved by Borough Council shall follow the same prescribed procedures, be entitled to the same rights, and pay the same fees as specified for residents in this Part 7.

§707. Permit Application.

1. An application for a residential parking district permit shall be made by a resident of a district to the Borough Office on forms provided by the Borough. The application for a permit shall contain information to verify that the applicant is a bona fide resident of the district for which application has been made and has legal title to or the right to possession of the motor vehicle to be permitted. The information shall include but not be limited to the following:
 - A. Applicant's name, address, operator's permit number, and date of issuance;
 - B. Vehicle owner's name, address, operator's permit number, and date of issuance;
 - C. The make, model, color, state of registration, and license number of the vehicle to be registered.
2. A parking permit may not be issued for any motor vehicle for which one or more unpaid citations have been issued by the Borough for parking violations. The Borough shall issue the parking permit upon finding the applicant meets the requirements specified in this section and has paid the required fee.

§708. Permit Fee and Term.

The biannual permit fee for a residential parking district permit shall be established by resolution of Borough Council. The fee shall be payable at the time the application is submitted. The permit term for each residential parking district shall be determined at the time the district is designated. Residential parking permits may be renewed by qualified residents upon the payment of the biannual fee on or before the anniversary date of the term. In order to renew the permit, residents must present their short-term visitors' passes. The fee shall be prorated; after the midpoint of the permit term, residents shall pay one-half of the established fee. No portion of any fee is refundable.

§709. Display of Permit.

The permit shall be affixed to the front windshield directly above the inspection sticker of the vehicle. Short-term visitors' passes, temporary passes and school zone permits shall be displayed on the front dash of the vehicle. Failure to properly display the permit or visitor's pass may result in a parking violation and/or fine.

§710. Expiration of Permits.

A permit expires and is void when the owner or user of a permitted vehicle no longer resides within the district, as defined in this Part 7. A resident shall remove a permit sticker from any permitted motor vehicle upon its expiration or upon moving outside of the district. Furthermore, a resident shall return short-term visitors' passes to the Police Department. Permits shall be transferred from one vehicle to another during the permit period solely in accordance with regulations governing such transfers.

§711. Permit Transfers and Replacements.

When a vehicle to which is a permit is affixed is sold, transferred, demolished, or in any other manner rendered unusable to the resident, the resident shall remove the permit from the motor vehicle and may request the issuance of a replacement permit. The permittee shall notify the Police Department of a change in status of the motor vehicle. The application for a replacement permit shall be the same as the application for an original or renewal permit. The replacement permit shall be issued and be valid for the unexpired term of the original permit, except that a replacement permit may not be issued for any motor vehicle for which one or more unpaid citations have been issued by the

Borough for parking violations. The fee for a replacement permit shall be prorated as set forth in §708.

§712. Temporary Permits.

The Police Department shall issue a temporary residential parking permit for use by a bona fide long-term visitor to a residence within a residential parking district. An application for a long-term temporary permit shall be made by a resident of a district on a form that shall be prescribed by the Police Department. The long-term visitor parking permit shall be valid for a seven-day period. The fee for a temporary permit, if any, shall be established by resolution of Borough Council.

§713. Residential Parking Districts Designated.

The following areas of the Borough of Stroudsburg are hereby designated as residential parking districts with the parking restrictions described below:

A. The Hill District.

- (1) The Hill District shall encompass the permitted parking on Scott Street from North Eighth Street to North Fifth Street; the permitted parking on Thomas Street from Stone Street to North Fifth Street; the permitted parking on the north side of Sarah Street from North Eighth Street to North Fifth Street; the permitted parking on North Eighth Street from Sarah Street to Scott Street; the permitted parking on North Seventh Street from Thomas Street to Scott Street; the permitted parking on North Sixth Street from Sarah Street to Scott Street; and the permitted parking on Wallace Street from Thomas Street to Scott Street. The residential parking district restrictions for the Hill District shall be in effect Monday through Saturday, inclusive, from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., prevailing time. Motor vehicles not displaying a valid residential parking district permit may not be parked on the streets of the Hill District for more than one hour, with the exception of metered parking spaces on Sarah Street. The parking restrictions set forth in this subsection shall not apply on the following holidays: New Years Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas. The permit term for the Hill District shall commence on October 1 and expire two years later on September 30.
- (2) Within the boundaries of the Hill District, there shall be a school zone in the vicinity of the Ramsey Elementary School. The school zone shall

encompass the permitted parking on Scott Street from Wallace to North Seventh; the permitted parking on North Seventh Street from Scott to Thomas; the permitted parking on Thomas Street from North Seventh to Wallace; and the permitted parking on North Sixth Street from Thomas to Scott. The Stroudsburg School District shall receive, for a fee as required in §708 hereof, 17 permits to park within the school zone as follows: five permits on Scott Street; four on Thomas; and four permits on North Sixth Street. The school zone parking permits shall be valid only Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., prevailing time. The term of the permits for the school zone shall be established by §708 and §713A(1) hereof. The permits shall be retained by the school district for use by school district employees only.

- B. The West Side District. The West Side District shall encompass the permitted parking on Linden Street from West Main Street to Hamilton Street; Fetherman Street from Main Street to Dreher Avenue; and Tenth Street from Main Street to Ninth Street. The residential parking district restrictions for the West Side District shall be in effect Monday through Friday, inclusive, from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., prevailing time. Motor vehicles not displaying a valid residential parking district permit may not be parked on the streets of the West Side District for more than one hour. The parking restrictions set forth in this subsection shall not apply on the following holidays: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas. The permit term for the West Side District shall commence on November 1 and expire two years later on October 30.
- C. The South Side District. The South Side District shall encompass the permitted parking on Bryant Street between Park Avenue and Broad Street. The residential parking district restrictions for the South Side District shall be in effect Monday through Saturday, inclusive, from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., prevailing time. Motor vehicles not displaying a valid residential parking district permit may not be parked on the streets of the South Side District for more than one (1) hour. The parking restrictions set forth in this subsection shall not apply on the following holidays: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. The permit term for the South Side District shall commence on June 1 and expire two (2) years later on May 31. [Ord. 904]

§714. Penalties.

1. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part shall be assessed a fine of \$15 if paid within 10 days.
2. If not paid within 10 days of the date on the ticket, the fine will be increased to \$35. [Ord. 916]
3. If payment is not made within 20 days of the date on the ticket, prosecution will be initiated for said violation, and the owner shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$60, together with costs of prosecution. [Ord. 916]

§715. Severability.

In the event that any provision, section, sentence, or clause of this Part 7 shall be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect or impair any remaining provision, section, sentence, or clause of this Part 7. It is the intent of this Borough that such remainder shall be and shall remain in full force and effect.

Part 8

Fire Lanes

§801. Authority of the Fire Marshall.

The Fire Marshall of the Borough of Stroudsburg shall have the authority to designate and mark such fire lanes as may be reasonable and necessary on private property devoted to public use. Stroudsburg Borough Council shall adopt a resolution approving these areas so designated by the Fire Marshall as "fire lanes" within said Borough. Such fire lanes shall be those areas immediately adjacent to a building or buildings for a distance of 24 feet from said building or buildings or 24 feet from the curb adjacent to said building or buildings on property such as shopping centers, bowling alleys, theaters, hospitals, churches and similar locations as may be deemed necessary by the Fire Marshall to insure proper ingress and egress of fire department and emergency vehicles for the protection of persons and property. Parking in such fire lanes shall be prohibited and such fire lanes shall be posted "No Parking—Fire Lane."

§802. Areas Posted.

Whenever the Fire Marshall of Stroudsburg Borough shall determine that parking or motor vehicles upon any public or private street, lane, alley or private parking lot is liable to interfere with the operation of the fire or police departments or hamper egress of occupants from buildings in case of fire or emergency, parking in such areas shall be prohibited and said areas shall be posted "No Parking—Fire Lane."

§803. Private Property.

On private property that is devoted to public use, there shall be maintained one or more unobstructed lanes to provide for the ingress and egress of fire department vehicles, equipment and personnel, said lanes to be a minimum of 12 feet in width each and laid out for convenient access from the public thoroughfares and water supplied to the building and buildings. The marking of said lanes shall be performed and maintained by, and at the expense of, the property owner or occupier.

MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

§804. Unlawful Acts.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to barricade, stop a vehicle, park or otherwise block any of the passage, entrance or exit ways to, in, about or out of any public building or any place occupied for public use or accommodation, whether upon public or private property, so as to interfere with or obstruct the free and unimpeded passage of persons and fire equipment around the said building, nor shall any person park a motor or trailer in disregard of any sign erected pursuant to the provisions of this Part.

§805. Building Defined.

For the purpose of this Part, the term "building" shall mean the exterior surface of the vertical wall of the structure, excluded any marquee, portico, mansard roof or similar appendages.

§806. Fire Marshall Defined.

For the purpose of this Part, the term "Fire Marshall" shall mean the Chief of the Stroudsburg Borough Volunteer Fire Department or his designee.

§807. Notice of Violation.

Notice of violation of this Part shall be effectuated by the placing of a parking ticket upon the vehicle parked or stopped in the fire lane in question.

§808. Penalties.

1. Any person, firm or corporation, etc., or its agent, servant, employee, etc., violating any of the provisions of this Part, upon conviction thereof before a District Magistrate, shall be fined not less than \$15 nor more than \$300 for each offense, together with costs of prosecution and, in default of payment thereof, shall be committed to the Monroe County Correctional Facility for a period of not more than 10 days. Each day, or portion thereof, during which such violation shall continue shall be deemed a separate offense and punishable as such.

2. If not paid within 10 days of the date on the ticket, the fine will be increased to \$35. [Ord. 916]
3. If payment is not made within 20 days of the date on the ticket, prosecution will be initiated, and the fine will be increased to \$60 plus the cost of prosecution. [Ord. 916]

§809. Purpose.

It is declared that enactment of this Part is necessary for the protection, benefit and preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Borough of Stroudsburg and the general public.
