ARTICLE I  
**Discharge of Firearms**  
[Adopted 1-15-1962 as Ord. No. 1010]

§ 106-1. Prohibited discharge; exceptions.

From and after the passage and effective date of this Article, no person shall, except in necessary defense of person or property, fire or discharge any firearm, rifle, air gun, spring gun or any implement which impels with force a metal pellet of any kind, within the Borough of Dormont; except that nothing herein contained shall prohibit the School District of the Borough of Dormont from constructing, supervising, operating and maintaining a rifle range on the property of such school district within the Borough of Dormont.

§ 106-2. Violations and penalties.<sup>1</sup>

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Article shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than six hundred dollars (\$600.) and costs of prosecution and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment in the county jail for not more than thirty (30) days.

ARTICLE II  
**Bows and Spring Guns**  
[Adopted 5-7-1962 as Ord. No. 1014; amended in its entirety  
at time of adoption of Code<sup>2</sup>]

**§ 106-3. Prohibited discharge; exceptions.**

From and after the passage and effective date of this Article, no person shall discharge any arrow from a bow or spring gun or indulge in any archery contests within the Borough of Dormont; except that nothing herein contained shall prohibit the School District of the Borough of Dormont from constructing, supervising and operating an archery range and archery contents in conjunction with the educational and recreational program of said school district.

**§ 106-4. Violations and penalties.**

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Article shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than six hundred dollars (\$600.) and costs of prosecution and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to undergo imprisonment in the county jail for not more than thirty (30) days.
