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**§ 98-1. Title.**

This chapter shall be known and designated as the “Electrical Code of the Borough of Dormont.”

**§ 98-2. Adoption of standards.**

The Council of the Borough of Dormont hereby adopts the National Electrical Code which was adopted by the National Fire Protection Association, Inc. (1990 Edition), as fully and completely as though said Electrical Code were set forth herein at length, except and unless otherwise provided to the contrary in the Statutes of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the rules and regulations of the County of Allegheny and any other specific provisions contained in this chapter. Copies of the Electrical Code may be examined during regular business hours at the office of the Borough Manager at 2975 West Liberty Avenue, Dormont, Pennsylvania 15216.

**§ 98-3. Effect on existing conditions.**

Nothing in this chapter or any part thereof or in the Building Code, Electrical Code, Fire Prevention Code or Mechanical Code shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court or any rights acquired or liabilities incurred or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing under any act or ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this chapter.

**§ 98-4. Liability.**

The owner, general contractor, subcontractor, material supplier and the person or persons directly responsible for any damage, injury to private or public property or right-of-way or any

violation of any provisions of this chapter and all other ordinances incorporated herein by reference shall be jointly and severally liable for any and all damage or injury and for the violation of this chapter. Any damage or violation caused to private or public property or right-of-way shall be repaired, replaced, made good or otherwise corrected as soon as possible, and any violation of the provisions of this chapter shall cease immediately.

**§ 98-5. Violations and penalties.<sup>1</sup>**

Any person, firm or corporation who or which violates any provision of this chapter shall be subject to a penalty of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.) for each violation, plus costs of prosecution for each offense, and, in default of payment of such fine and/or costs, shall be subject to imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days.
