§ 102-1. Unlawful acts.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to commit or cause to be committed any act or acts of disorderly conduct within West Deer Township, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania.
- B. The following acts are defined and declared to be disorderly conduct in violation of this chapter:
 - (1) Refusing to obey any lawful order issued by any policeman of Township of West Deer while in the performance of his or her duties.
 - (2) Willfully making or causing to be made any loud, boisterous and unseemly noise or disturbance to the annoyance of the peaceable residents of the township whereby the public peace is broken or disturbed or the public is annoyed.
 - (3) Appearing in a drunken or intoxicated condition in or on any public street, alley, park or public building.
 - (4) Prowling or loitering about the property of other persons or peering or peeping into any house or other structures without the consent of the owner.

- (5) The uttering of profane, obscene or indecent language to any police officer of West Deer Township.
- (6) The operation of construction equipment, machinery or trucks at such an unreasonable time to cause or tend to cause a disturbance or annoyance to the peaceable residents in the vicinity.
- (7) The causing of any unjustified disturbance of the peace of the community.

§ 102-2. Violations and penalties.¹ [Amended 1-22-1997 by Ord. No. 265]

Any person or entity who shall violate or cause a violation of any of the terms of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof before any District Justice, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000, plus any costs assessed by the District Justice, and, in default of said payment, be subject to a sentence of up to 30 days in the Allegheny County Jail.
